## District Grants

Districts must establish a grant committee of three Rotarians, including the district governor of the implementation year, the district Rotary Foundation committee chair, and the district grants subcommittee chair.

These three committee members are responsible for authorizing and submitting the district grant application. Districts may submit one application per Rotary year, and this application must include a spending plan. Any requests for an increase in the grant amount must be made before any portion of the grant has been paid by the Foundation. Districts may reserve up to 20 percent of their district grant funds for contingencies that may arise during the year; note this contingency fund on the spending plan and itemize contingency items when you submit your final report.

All districts are requested to apply for their district grant applications before on by 15 May of the Rotary year for which the funds are requested. (For example, applications for 2017-18 district grants must be received by 15 May 2018.)

## **Global Grants**

Primary host and international sponsors must each establish a grant committee of three Rotarians for a global grant. Members of this grant committee must come from the primary sponsor club (if the grant is club-sponsored) or district (if the grant is district-sponsored). For club-sponsored grant applications, district Rotary Foundation committee chairs must confirm that the primary sponsor clubs are qualified.

Note that:

- If grant applications are not formally submitted within 12 months of initiation, the application will be canceled.
- If grant applications are not completed and approved within six months of submission, the application will be canceled.
- If payment requirements are not met within six months of approval, the grant will be canceled.
- If grants are not implemented within 12 months of payment, the grant will be canceled and the sponsors will be required to return the funds.

## **POLIO UPDATES**

Outbreaks of vaccine-derived polio have been reported this month in the Democratic Republic of Congo and Syria, according to the [World Health Organization](#).

At least 17 cases were identified in Syria and at least four in Congo. In both countries, health officials are working with the [Global Polio Eradication Initiative](#) to respond immediately to the outbreaks with supplementary immunization activities and field investigations.

To prevent the virus from spreading further, investigations and immunizations are also being strengthened in neighboring countries, the World Health Organization said.

Despite the new cases, the push to eradicate polio is stronger than ever, with fewer cases reported so far this year than ever before. It also got a boost last week at the Rotary International Convention in Atlanta, Georgia, USA, where Rotary committed to raise \$50 million per year over the next three years, with every dollar to be matched with two additional dollars from the Gates Foundation. This expanded agreement will translate into \$450 million for polio eradication activities, including immunization and surveillance over the next three years. Also, Governments of various countries and other donors [pledged](#) \$1.2 billion for the effort.

### TERMINATED CLUBS

Clubs terminated for non-payment of January 2017 dues are required to fulfill following compliances for re-instatement within **150 days** of date of termination:

- Pay all outstanding financial obligations at the time of termination.
- Pay all membership dues that continue to accrue thereafter.
- Pay a \$30 per member reinstatement fee plus service tax @15%
- Reinstatement application.

**After 150 days from the date of termination, clubs will be permanently terminated and cannot be reinstated.**

July 2017 Invoice will be sent to Clubs by the end of July.

### PAYMENT INSTRUCTIONS FOR CLUB DUES:

- We would recommend sending club dues electronically by using 'Bank/ Electronic Transfer' details mentioned that will be mentioned in the July 2017 Club Invoice. **'Bank/Electronic transfer' details will be club specific**, therefore clubs must use details as mentioned in their respective 'club invoice' only. Also, these details are **for the purpose of paying club dues only** and not for any other type of

dues/contributions. **Kindly remember that information/details given in the previous invoice do not stand good now** and would lead to non-payment and inconvenience at your end.

- In the event a club is unable to pay club dues electronically, payment may be sent by Cheque/demand draft drawn in favor of 'Rotary International South Asia Office' payable at New Delhi, along with copy of invoice, to South Asia Office.
- Payment to be made in INR only. Visit <https://my.rotary.org/en/exchange-rates> for the most current RI exchange rate to calculate the amount in INR.

## **PAYMENT INSTRUCTIONS FOR TRF DONATIONS/CONTRIBUTIONS**

### **a) Online Giving by Donors in India**

Rupee-enabled online giving is now available to Donors in India. They can choose to make online contributions in INR through both Rotary Foundation (India) [RF(I)] website [www.rotaryfoundationindia.org](http://www.rotaryfoundationindia.org) or through Rotary International website [www.rotary.org](http://www.rotary.org). This will allow Rotarians/Non-Rotarians to contribute online and also avail the benefits under Section 80G of Income Tax Act.

### **b) Donation/Contribution through Cheque/Demand Draft**

- Draw a cheque/demand draft in favor of '**Rotary Foundation (India)**' payable at New Delhi. Please mention the donor's name clearly (i.e. drawer of the cheque/remitter of bank draft), donor address and donor's Permanent Account Number (PAN) in the contribution form/ letter.
- A single receipt per cheque will be issued in favor of the drawer of the cheque.
- A single receipt for each demand draft/pay order will be issued in favor of the remitter, if mentioned in demand draft/pay order

## **THE GOODS & SERVICE TAX (GST)**

The GST Laws (including relating Bills) that came into effect from July 1, 2017 may impact the working of the Rotary Clubs. Therefore it is advised that Rotary Clubs contact their Chartered Accountants/ Tax Advisors for further information/ update on this matter.

Those clubs that are required by law to have a GST registration number are requested to provide the details to SAO as soon the same is received from the authorities.

Clubs that have already got themselves or are in the process of getting registered under GST are requested to send following details through their registered email ID to [nidhi.khanna@rotary.org](mailto:nidhi.khanna@rotary.org)

### **Details required:**

- Club Name and Club Number
- Special Status (if applicable) along with supporting document issued by competent authorities (for e.g: SEZ exemptions)
- Copy of registration certificate, duly attested by account signatories

There is a critical provision in GST that mandates the "state" code of your GST registration and the "state" of your mailing address available with the SAO to be identical. In case they are different, we request you to update your mailing address of the club in RI records to comply with the above requirement.
